Personally appeared John Griffith Aye Sixty Nine
years - A resident Citizen of the United States - Now
residing in Aston Township in the County of Delaware
who being by me duly sworn according to law doth de-
pose and say - That by reason of his reduced circum-
stances in life, he needs the assistance of his Country
for Support - And that he was a private Soldier in
the War of the Revolution for the term of five years
and Nine Months on the continental establishment
That he enlisted with Capt. Anderson for one year
and Nine Months in the Regt. commanded by Col. Atlee
of the Penn. Line and served his time fully out - That
he afterwards enlisted with Capt. Taylor of Col. Johnstones
Regt. of the Penn. Line for three years and served about
one year more than the time when he was discharged by
Genl. Anthony Wayne at Trenton New Jersey - That
his first Enlistment was in 1776 and he believes his last
discharge was 1782 in January - And that he has lost
both the said discharges - Nor does he know that any such
discharge is now in existence - That he was in the engage-
ment with the enemy on Long Island - was engaged against
the enemy at the Battle of Brandywine - Was at the Mass-
acre at the Packer - in the battles of Germantown - Morro-
-with and others of less importance.

And the said John Griffith doth hereby renin-
-quish his claim to every Pension / Money / heretofore
allowed him by the Laws of the United States.
