

he assisted to draw twelve cannons to the magazine and spike them. From there they marched to Hackensack thence by several marches to Brunswick at which place the British were close in pursuit. They then marched two or three miles from Brunswick where they remained until their term of service expired. They then went to Philad<sup>a</sup> & were discharged.

Applicant also went in 1777 from Fredericktown in the Militia for six months under Col. Johnson Lieut Col. M<sup>r</sup> Luckett, Major Butler & Capt<sup>n</sup> Huff. From Frederick they marched to Hookstown & staid there two days. thence to the Susquehanna River & camped twenty five miles below peach bottom ferry. Thence to the head of Elk River where the English had landed. Thence to Brandywine thence to Paoli, where they sustained an attack from the British. Thence they marched to the Red Lion. Thence to Valley Forge - and from there to Germantown in which battle this applicant was engaged. After that he became unwell & remained about in different places until his time expired - -

Applicant states that he was born in Lancaster County Penn<sup>a</sup> on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of October 1753. That he was twenty three years old when he entered the service after he was discharged he lived 10. or 12 years in Frederick County. From there he removed to Washington Co<sup>y</sup>
