On this 15th day of August A.D. one thousand eight hundred and twenty two personally appeared in open court of Common Pleas being a Court of Record declared such by Act of Assembly of Pennsylvania for the said County Adams Stonetraker aged seventy years resident in the Township of Franklin County aforesaid who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows first enlisted in Hagerstown Maryland and served in the Company commanded by Captain Williams Hiser in the Regiment commanded then by Colonel Hoosier and afterwards by Colonel Waller he having succeeded to the command of said Regiment called the German Regiment and that my declaration dated the 6th May 1818 has already been made in conformity to the Act of the 11th March 1818 and that I have received a Pension the Number of my Pension Certificate is 5,104 and I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress intitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval services of the United States in the Revolutionary war passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed viz one large English Bible one old English watch one chest and a Pension of forty Dollars a year from the State of Pennsylvania

I do also declare that my occupation is as Miller but being deprived of my hearing and other infirmities am not able to pursue said occupation nor any other so as to procure myself a living and that no part of my family now lives with me my wife being dead and my children having all left me deconsolidated and declared in open court on the 15th day of August 1820} Adams Stonetraker
