I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim W. 3291 it appears that John Detrich Aurandt (name also spelled Aurand, Ourandt, Ourhand) and pensioned Description Ourhand, was born November 8, 1761. He was a German, and was referred to as Reverend John Detrich Aurandt.

He enlisted in Muffalo Township, Northumberland County, Pennsylvania January 14, 1778, served as a private in Captains George Whetzel's and John Bankson's Companies, Colonel Walter Stewart's Second Pennsylvania Regiment, was in the battles of Monmouth, Paulus Hook, Springfield, Salisbury, and in a number of skirmishes and was discharged January 14, 1781.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 1, 1818 while a resident of Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania, and in 1821 was living in Morris Township in said county. He died April 24, 1831 in Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania.
