At a court of common Pleas

helden this day to wit the 15th day of August 1820
at Huntingdon, in and for said County, before the
Honorable Charles Huston Esq; & his Associates Elarie
Stewart and Joseph McCune Esq; no Judge of said Court
being a Court of Record personally appeared in open
Court Alexander Campbell who being duly sworn de-
poseth and saith, and on his Oath afforward, doth
declare that he served as a soldier in the Revolutionary
War for the space of three years, in a Company com-
manded by Captain Thomas Robarge in the Third
Regiment commanded by Colonel James Malcom
of the New York Line, as set forth in his original Decla-
ration, the date of which he doth not now precisely
recollect, but believes it was some time in June 1808
which said Declaration was forwarded to the War
Department, & on which a Pension Certificate
issued to the said Alexander Campbell dated the
21st day of September 1818 signed J. C. Calhoun Secre-
tary of War which Certificate is without writing
any number, and is now in possession of Decla-
rant, who in pursuance of the Act of Congress of
the 20th May 1820 makes the following Declaration
on Oath to wit I Alexander Campbell do swear
that I was a Resident citizen of the United States
on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not
since that time, by gift, sale, or in any Manner
disposed of my property, or any part thereof with
an intent thereby to diminish it, so to bring myself with-
in the Provisions of an Act of Congress, entitled
an Act to provide for certain persons engaged in
the Land and Naval Service of the United States
in the Revolutionary War passed on the 18th day of
