

Declaration

In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed
June 7th 1830.

State of Pennsylvania

Huntingdon County S^t On this 14th day of August 1857, personally
appeared before the Court of Common Pleas of said County Valentine Hefner a resident
of Walker township in the County of Huntingdon and State of Pennsylvania aged Twenty eight years
who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order
to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress, passed June 7th 1832

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and terms
as herein stated. That he entered the service of the United States in the Summer of the year
1777. That he was drafted out to serve in the militia of the County of Franklin in the State
of Pennsylvania and that he was drafted in the year 1777 on the first of June of the
said year. That he was drafted out for the period of six months in the County of Franklin & that

that this applicant served said six months under Capt Daniel Blappadler who was a Captain
of militia Company of the Franklin County militia legally embodied and called into service by the
Committee of Safety. That his applicant says his name of the Lieutenant was one Adam Smith

and that he served in a Regiment of Franklin County militia commanded by Col Johnson and
the name of the Major of the said Regiment was Major Johnson. That this applicant joined a corps
of militia of the Franklin County militia Pa. near Hagerstown Md. where there was a corps of the
militia assembling for the purpose of marching to the neighborhood of Philadelphia Pa. on the
Delaware River. That his applicant understood that the British Army were marching towards the
City of Phila. with a design as was supposed to capture it and the militia were called out to go
down and defend it. That this applicant was marched down to and stationed on land along
the said river and was attached with other corps of militia to a considerable body of militia
soldiers under the command of General Arnold on the west side of the Delaware River above
Philadelphia. That this applicant was afterwards with the company to which he belonged trans-

ferred and attached to a body of the Pennsylvania militia under the command of General
Armstrong and marched on towards the Brandywine River.

That the British compelled
the Americans to retreat back towards the city of Philadelphia. That this applicant
was with a corps of militia troops posted near the Schuylkill River with his Capt.
and Companions under General Armstrong to stop the passage of the enemy
over the Schuylkill River towards the City of Philadelphia.

That this applicant during this said term of six months was stationed for a part
of the time on the Ridge Road. That the advance party to which he was attached and
