Huntingdon County Oct 3<sup>rd</sup>

On this sixteenth day of April 1824 personally appeared in open Court, Before the Honorable Charles Huston Esq; Resident and David Stewart and Joseph McLean Esquires, his associates Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Huntingdon, in the fourth Judicial District of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, (said Court being a Court of Record by the Laws of said Commonwealth,) Alexander King, resident in said County aged sixty nine years, who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following Declaration, in order to obtain the provisions made by the Acts of Congress of the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818 and the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1820, that he the said Alexander King enlisted for the term of one year on (or about) the tenth day of January in the year 1776, in the State of Pennsylvania, in the company commanded by Captain Henry Darby, in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Hazell, and Lieutenant Colonel Bedford in the line of the State of Delaware in the Delaware Continental Establishment, that he continued to serve in the said Corps, until the expiration of one year from the time of his enlistment when he was discharged from the said service in New Ark in the state of Delaware. That he again enlisted for the term of three years, or during the War in the year 1777, in the company commanded by Captain Benjamin Bush, in the Fourth Regiment commanded by William Butler Lieutenant Colonel Commandant in the line of the State of Pennsylvania in the Pennsylvania Continental Establishment, that he continued to serve in the said Corps, until the year 1781, when he was discharged from the said service in Trenton, in the state of New Jersey, that his name has been placed on the Pension List, and draft therefrom on account of his Property.

And in pursuance of the Act of the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1820 I do solemnly swear that I was a Resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818, and that I have not since that time by Gift, Sale, or in any manner disposed of my Property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide for certain Persons, engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818; and that I have not, nor has any Person in Trust for me, any Property, a Securities, Contracts, or Debts due to me, nor have any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.
